

CLAY'S STORY

Clay was the oldest of three children raised in Round Rock, Texas. He was loyal and dedicated, sarcastic and competitive. Clay led many of us on the field, court, classroom and community as a man of character, integrity, faith and determination.

After the Round Rock High School football campaign of 1990, Clay was diagnosed with cancer. For the next two years, he would lead us in a greater campaign. At such a critical time in a young person's life, when many lose touch with family, values and religion, Clay drove us to find deeper devotion and faith—faith in the Lord, faith in our families, faith in each other and faith in our community. He rallied his family, friends and residents of Round Rock to fight the adversary, never showing signs of the toll it was taking on him emotionally, and never realizing the strength and inspiration he gave those around him.

Through the Clay Madsen Foundation, we continue to give to the Round Rock community that Clay so loved, and we do so in his name. In 2002, we established the Clay Madsen Foundation as a nonprofit organization to honor Clay by aiding families in Williamson County and surrounding areas who need who are fighting their own battles with cancer.

Moments before Clay passed, he asked his father, "Where are we going?" His father replied, "We are going to the house of the Lord." To which Clay answered his last words, "For Sure!"
